

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) is working to enhance safety and improve mobility by modernizing the I-75 freeway.



What Is Being Done?

MDOT is reconstructing and realigning 3.1 miles of I-75, including ramps; building a future high occupancy vehicle (HOV) lane; and replacing bridges at Square Lake Road, Adams Road, Squirrel Road, and the I-75/Square Lake Road interchange.

Where Is This Being Done?

The project is located on I-75 in Oakland County in the cities of Troy, Auburn Hills, and Bloomfield Township. Work extends from north of Coolidge Highway to north of South Boulevard, and includes the Square Lake Road and Adams Road interchanges.

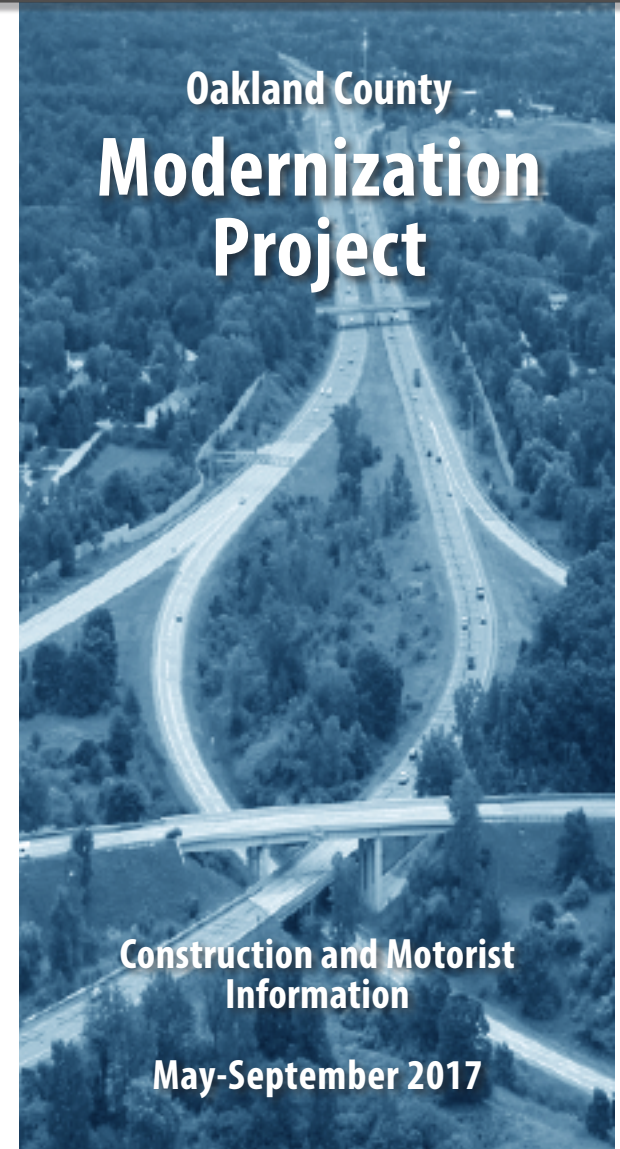

MODERNIZE 75

2017 Work

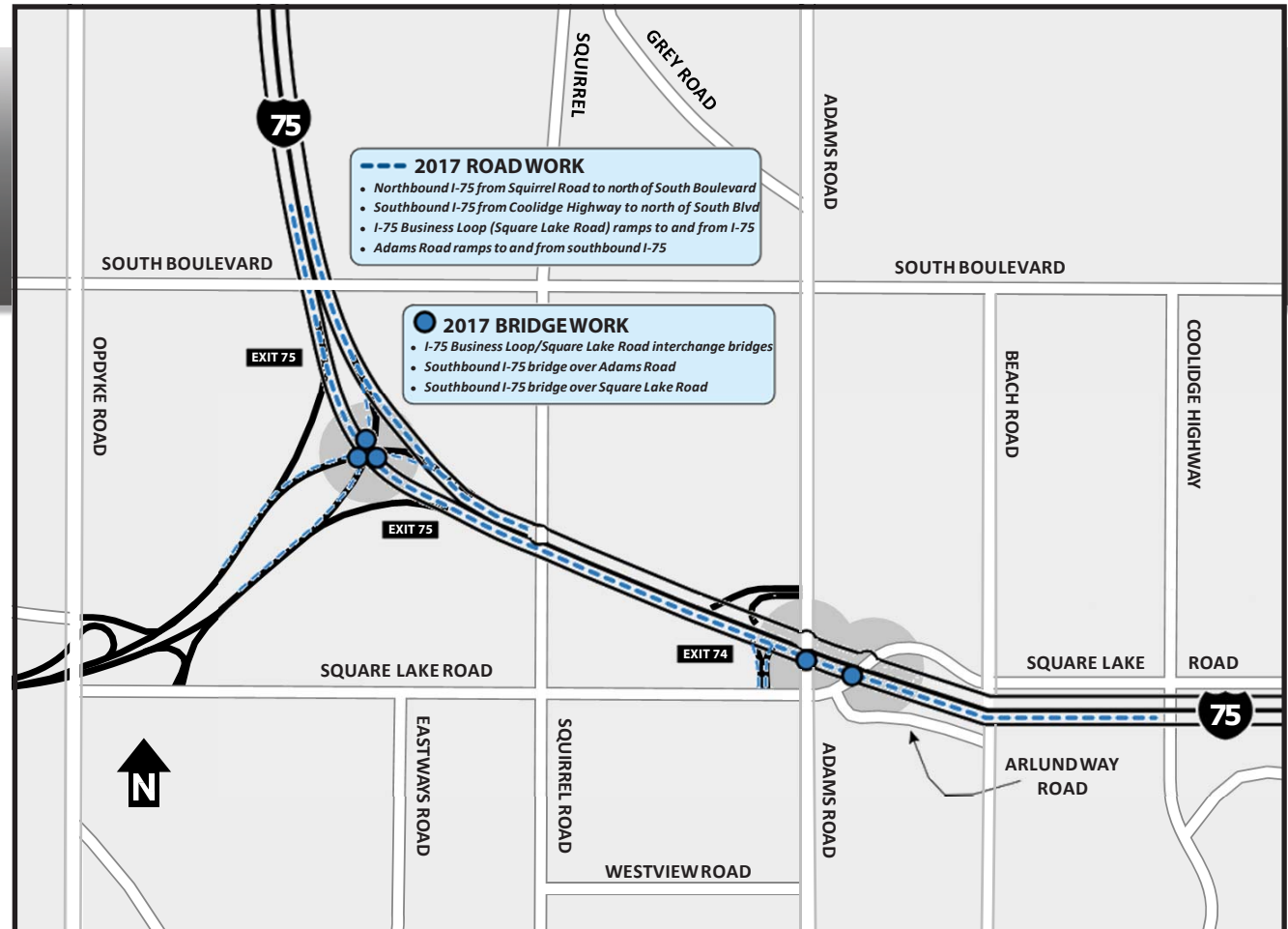
- The Michigan Department of Transportation's two-year, \$90.8 million project to modernize I-75 continues this year. Work starts in May and is expected to be finished in September.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

- Northbound I-75 from Squirrel Road to north of South Boulevard (1.5 miles).
- Southbound I-75 from Coolidge Highway to north of South Boulevard (3.1 miles).
- I-75 Business Loop (BL) (Square Lake Road) ramps to and from I-75.
- Adams Road ramps to and from southbound I-75.

BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION

- Three I-75 BL (Square Lake Road) interchange bridges.
- Southbound I-75 bridge over Adams Road.
- Southbound I-75 bridge over Square Lake Road.



2017 TRAFFIC IMPACT

- Two lanes will be open in each direction on I-75.
- Motorists and residents can expect limited nighttime and weekend freeway closures for bridge demolition and beam setting.

FALL 2017/SPRING 2018 WORK

- Repair the Adams Road carpool lot (fall 2017/spring 2018).
- Tree replacement, landscaping and site restoration (spring 2018).
